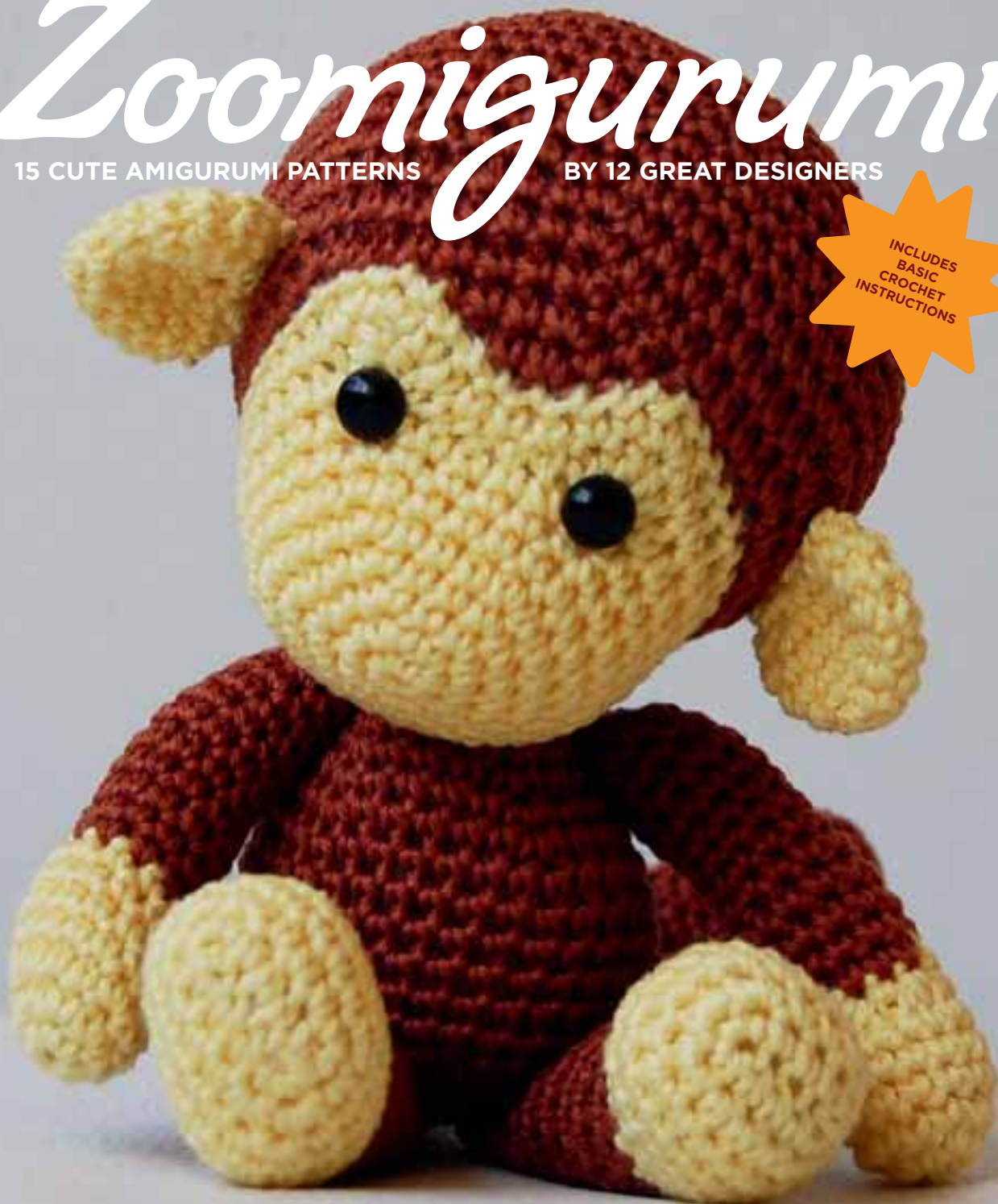

**11** **ZICO THE TOUCAN** (*Created by Ana Yogui*) Want to add a warm tropical feeling to your home? You need Zico, the toucan!

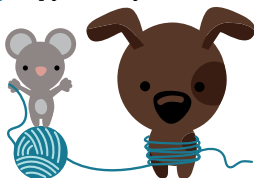

## BASIC STITCHES

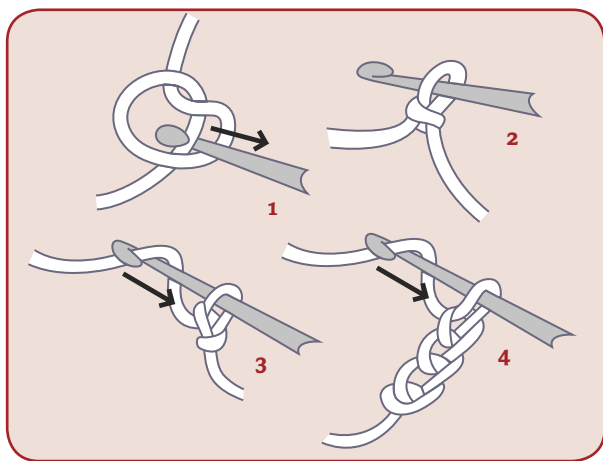
If this is your first time making amigurumi you might find it useful to have a tutorial of the most basic stitches. With the stitches explained here you can make all amigurumi in this book.

I suggest you try them before you start making one of the animals, it will surely help you read the patterns and abbreviations more comfortably without having to scroll back to these pages.

### CHAIN STITCH (*ch*)

This stitch is the basis for many crochet patterns. If you're working in rows, your first row will be a series of chain stitches.

Use the hook to draw the yarn through the loop (1) and pull the loop until tight (2). Wrap the yarn over the hook from back to front. Pull the hook, carrying the yarn, through the loop already on your hook (3). You have now completed one *chain stitch*. Repeat these steps as indicated in the pattern to create a foundation chain (4).



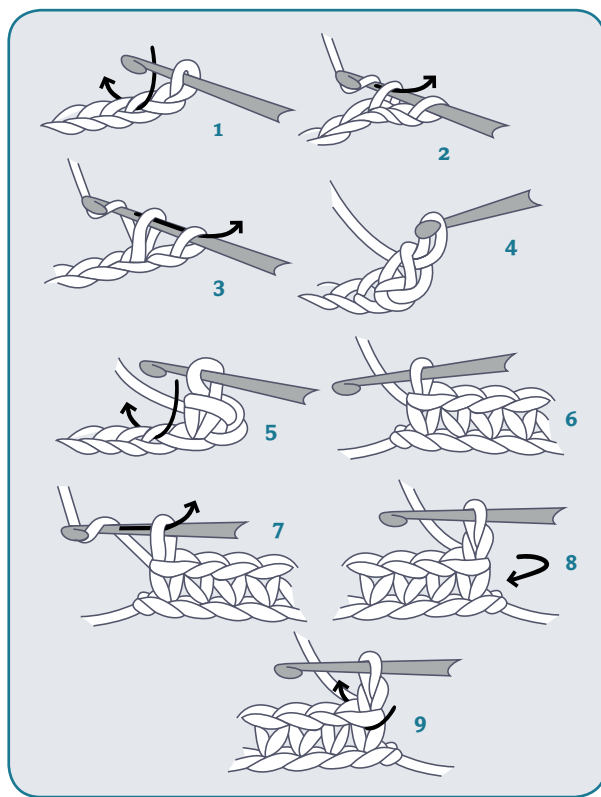
### SINGLE CROCHET (*sc*)

*Single crochet* is the stitch that will be most frequently used in this book.

Insert the hook into the next chain stitch (1) and wrap the yarn over the hook. Pull the yarn through the stitch (2). You will see that there are now two loops

on the hook. Wrap the yarn over the hook again and draw it through both loops at once (3). You have now completed one single crochet (4). Insert the hook into the next chain stitch to continue the row (5).

At the end of the row (6) you need to bring the yarn up to the correct height to work the first stitch. Make one chain stitch (*ch*) (7) and turn the work (8). Start the next single crochet in the first stitch (don't count the turning chain as a stitch). To work into a previous row of crochet, insert your hook under both loops of the first stitch, as shown in the figure (9).

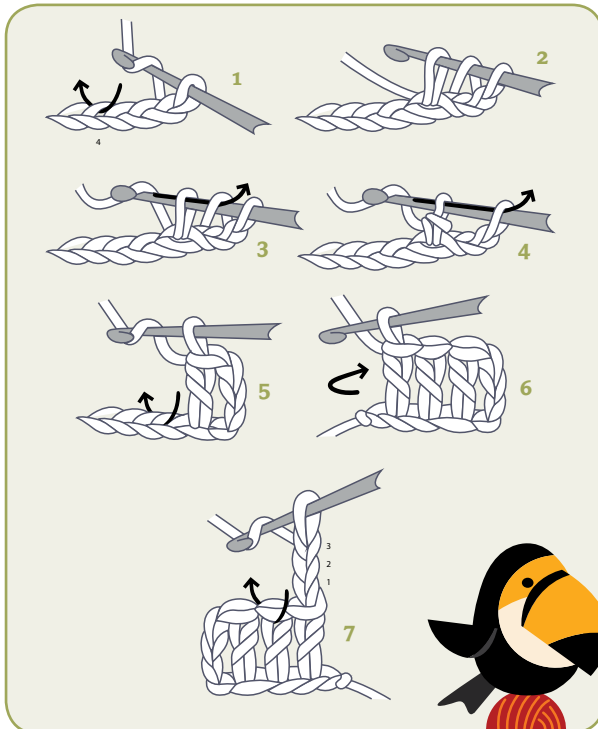


### DOUBLE CROCHET (*dc*)

Bring your yarn over the hook from back to front before placing the hook in the stitch. Now insert your hook in the fourth chain - without counting the loop on the hook (1). Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw the yarn through the chain stitch. You now have three

loops on the hook (2). Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through the first two loops on the hook (3). You now have 2 loops on the hook. Wrap the yarn over the hook one last time and draw it through both loops on the hook (4). You have now completed one *double crochet*. To continue bring your yarn over the hook and insert it in the next chain stitch (5).

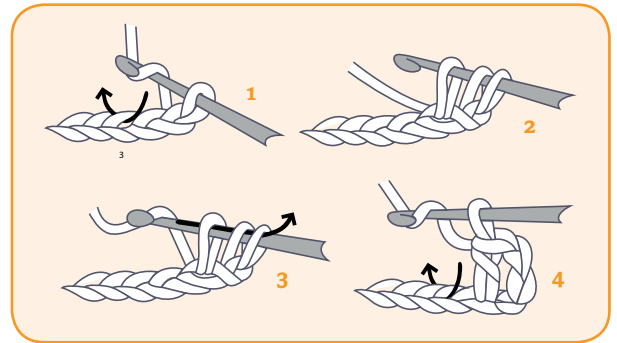
To start the second row, you turn the work (6). You will need to bring the thread up to the correct height to work the first stitch. To raise the yarn, make three chain stitches. These count as the first double crochet of the new row. Start the next double crochet in the second stitch. Be sure to insert your hook under both loops of this stitch (7).



### HALF DOUBLE CROCHET (*hdc*)

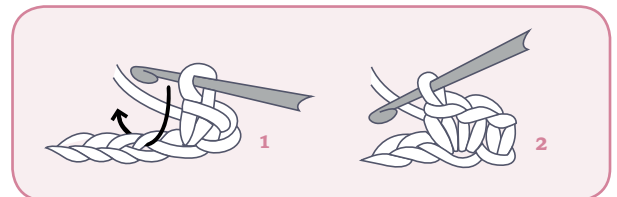
The *half double crochet* stitch resembles the double crochet stitch. Bring your yarn over the hook from back to front before placing the hook in the stitch. Now insert your hook in the fourth chain - without counting the loop

on the hook (1). Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw the yarn through the chain stitch. You now have three loops on the hook (2). Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through all three loops on the hook (3). You have completed your first *half double crochet*. To continue bring your yarn over the hook and insert it in the next chain stitch (4). To start a second row, bring your thread to the correct height by making two chain stitches.



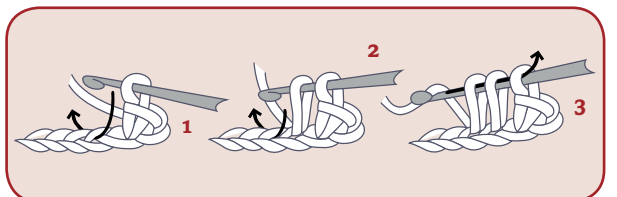
### INCREASE (*inc*)

To increase you need to make two single crochet stitches in the next stitch.



### DECREASE (*dec*)

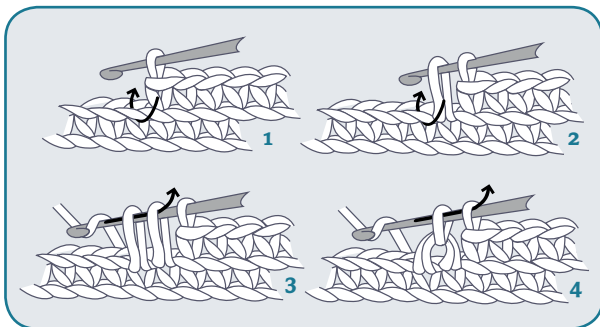
Insert your hook into the next stitch (1). Wrap the yarn over the hook and pull up a loop (2). Repeat this in the next stitch. There are now three loops on your hook. Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull it through all three loops on the hook (3). You have completed one decrease.



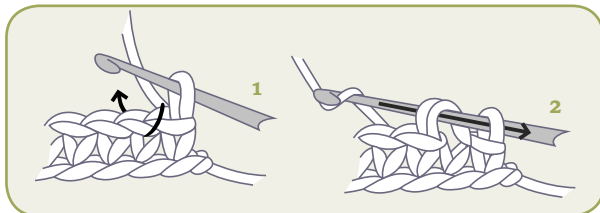
**INVISIBLE DECREASE**

The standard method of decreasing can leave a small bump or gap. The invisible decrease is an alternative method of decreasing which will make your decrease-stitch look much like the other stitches in the row, so it results in a more smooth and even crochetwork.

Insert the hook in the front loop of your first stitch (1). Now immediately insert your hook in the front loop of the second stitch (2). You now have three loops on your hook. Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw it through the first two loops on your hook (3). Wrap the yarn over again and draw it through the two loops remaining on your hook (4). You have now completed one *invisible decrease*.

**SLIP STITCH (slst)**

A *slip stitch* is used to move across one or more stitches at once. Insert your hook into the next stitch. Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw through both loops at once.

**BACK LOOPS ONLY (BLO) & FRONT LOOPS ONLY (FLO)**

When making a crochet stitch, you end up with two loops at the top of the stitch, a front loop (towards you) and a back loop. When asked to crochet FLO or BLO you make the same stitch but leave one loop untouched.

**MAGIC RING**

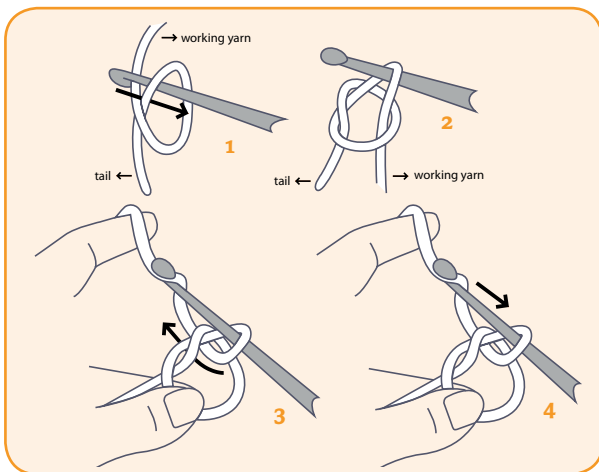
A magic ring is ideal to start crocheting in the round. You start by crocheting over an adjustable loop and in the end pull the loop tight. The advantage of this method is that there's no hole left in the middle of your starting round.

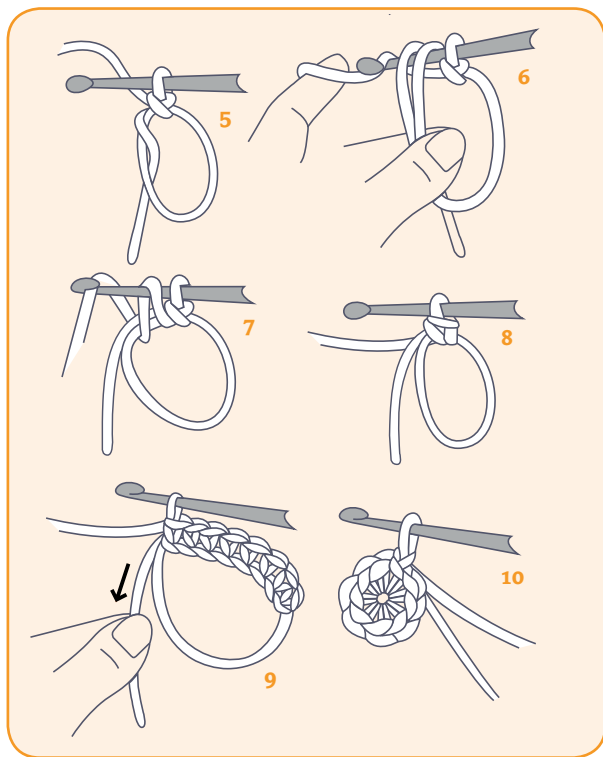
Start with the yarn crossed to form a circle (1). Draw up a loop with your hook but don't pull it tight (2). Hold the circle with your forefinger and thumb, and wrap the working yarn over your index finger (3). Make one chain stitch by wrapping the yarn over the hook and pulling it through the loop on your hook (4). Now insert your hook into the loop and underneath the tail. Wrap the yarn over the hook and draw up a loop (6). Wrap the yarn over the hook again and draw it through both loops on your hook (7). You have now completed your first single crochet (8). Continue to crochet until you have the required number of stitches as mentioned in the pattern.

Now grab the yarn tail and pull to draw the centre of the ring tightly closed.

You can now begin your second round by crocheting into the first stitch of the first round. You can use stitch markers to remember where you started.

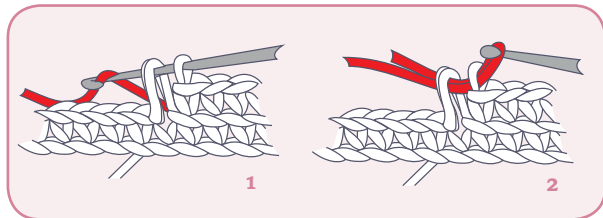
If you do not prefer this technique, you can start each piece using the following technique: ch 2, sc 6 times into the second chain from the hook. Slst to join the round.





### COLOR CHANGE

When you want to switch from one color to the next, you work to within two stitches before a color change. Make the next stitch as usual, but don't pull the final loop through (1). Instead, wrap the new color of yarn around your hook and pull it through the remaining loops (2). You can now continue with the new color. Tie a knot to the loose tails and leave them on the inside.



### FASTENING OFF AND JOINING ALL PARTS

When you're done crocheting, cut the yarn a couple of inches from your last stitch. Pull the yarn through the

last loop until it is all the way through (1). You now have a finished knot.

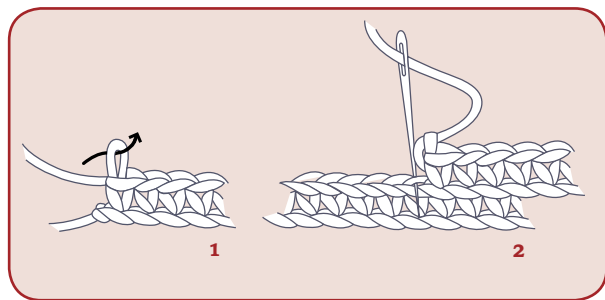
Thread the long tail through the tapestry needle and insert your tapestry needle through the back loop of the next stitch (2). This way the finishing knot will remain invisible in your finished piece. You can use this piece of yarn to continue sewing the body pieces together.

Always make sure pieces are securely attached so that they can't be pulled off. Make small, neat stitches and try to make them show as little as possible.

Some designers leave the extremities open for sewing onto the body, others sew them closed.

When open: Position the piece on the body and sew all around it, going through the front stitches of both the extremity and the body.

When the opening of the extremities is sewn closed before attaching it to the body, you line up the stitches of one side with the other side and sew through the front loop of one side and the back loop of the other side. Use the same color of yarn as (one of) the pieces you want to join together.



### WORKING IN ROUNDS

Crocheting in the round can be confusing since you form a continuous spiral. There's no clear indication of where a new round begins and the previous one ends. To keep track of the rounds, you can mark the end of a round with a stitch marker or safety pin. After crocheting the next round, you should end up right above your stitch marker. Move your stitch marker at the end of each round to keep track of where you are.

## BASIC MATERIAL

### YARN

With every pattern in this book we list the materials used to create that amigurumi, including the specific yarn that is used. But don't feel tied to the yarn choices, other types of cotton, acrylic or wool can be used as a substitute.

Yarn comes in different thicknesses. The yarn thickness is specified with every pattern. Much of what you need to know is on the yarn label, but it might take a little bit of decoding. Below we add a chart that can help you make the right choice.

The patterns don't give the yarn quantity. The amounts are rather small and will vary according to how loosely or tightly you crochet. You could use some of the remnants from other projects or start with a new ball of yarn.

### CROCHET HOOKS

Not only yarn, but hooks as well come in different sorts and sizes. Bigger hooks make bigger stitches than smaller ones. It is important to match the right hook with the right type of yarn. The size of hook used is indicated with every pattern, or can be consulted in the chart below.

The crochetwork should be quite tight, without any gaps through which stuffing can escape. You best use a

smaller hook than stated on the yarn to achieve this.

Hooks are usually made from aluminium or steel. Metal hooks tend to slip between the stitches more easily. For projects that require very thick yarn, a wooden hook might be a comfortable alternative.

### STUFFING/FACE FEATURES

For the filling polyester fiberfill is advised. You can purchase this at any yarn shop and it has the great advantage that it is inexpensive, washable and non-allergenic. Be careful not to overstuff your animal. Stuffing might stretch the fabric and show through.

For some patterns safety eyes are used. These are widely available. Be alert when you apply safety eyes: once you put the washer on you won't be able to pull it off again. So you best make sure the post is where you want it before attaching the washer.

Alternatively, the features can be embroidered, which is recommended if you're crocheting for children under the age of three. For embroidery a tapestry needle with a rounded tip is used.

### SKILL LEVEL

Every pattern is marked with a skill level to indicate how easy they are to make. Start with an easy pattern and work up to the intermediate and experienced ones.

# ZICO THE TOUCAN

**Skill level:** \*\*

**Size:** 3.5 inches (9 cm) tall.

**Materials:**

- Light Worsted weight yarn in black, yellow and white.
- Two 8 mm blue safety eyes
- Size G-6 (4 mm) crochet hook
- Needle for joining parts
- Fiberfill for stuffing



**HEAD / BODY** (in black yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6-10:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 9 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [33]

**Rnd 12-15:** sc in all 33 st [33]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 10 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [36]

**Rnd 17-20:** sc in all 36 st [36]

Now we will start to make the tail.

**Rnd 1:** Using FLO, sc in next 9 st, ch 9, slst on top of first sc to form a circle.

**Rnd 2:** ch 1, sc in next 17 st [18]

**Rnd 3:** sc on top of ch 1, sc in next 17 st [18]

**Rnd 4:** Sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 5:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 3 times [15]

**Rnd 6:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 7:** (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 3 times [18]

**Rnd 8-11:** sc in all 18 st [18]

Slst in next st. Fasten off and leave enough yarn to close the tail.

**BOTTOM** (in black yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring. [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 36 st [36]

Slst in next st. Fasten off and leave enough yarn to attach the bottom to the body.

## 12 ZICO THE TOUCAN



### WHITE BREAST / FACE (in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** 3 sc in next st, sc in next 2 st, 3 sc in next st, sc in next 2 st [10]

**Rnd 3:** inc in next 3 st, sc in next 2 st, inc in next 3 st, sc in next 2 st [16]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times. sc in next 2 st. (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times. sc in next 2 st [22]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times. sc in next 2 st. (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times. sc in next 2 st. Change to yellow yarn [28]

**Rnd 6 – Rnd 8:** sc in next 5 st. Change to white yarn. sc in next 18 st. Change to yellow yarn. sc in next 5 st. Slst in next st. Fasten off and leave enough yarn to attach breast to body.

### BEAK (start in black yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]

**Rnd 2:** inc in next 2 st. Change to yellow yarn. inc in next 2 st. Change to black yarn [8]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 2 times. Change to yellow yarn. (sc, inc in next st) repeat 2 times.

Change to black yarn. [12]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 2 times. Change to yellow yarn. (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 2 times [16]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 6-10:** sc in all 20 st. Change to black yarn. [20]

**Rnd 11:** sc in all 20 st [20]

Slst in next st. Fasten off and leave enough yarn to attach the beak to the head.

### WINGS (make 2 in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring. [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** inc in all 36 st [36]

Slst in next st and fasten off. Leave enough yarn to close the wing and to attach it to the body.

### ASSEMBLING

- Position the breast to the body.
- Position and attach the safety eyes.
- Attach the breast to the body.
- Stuff and attach the beak. Make sure the black part is upwards.
- Stuff the body and attach the bottom to the body.
- Stitch the tail closed.
- Fold the wings in half and stitch them closed.
- Attach the wings to the body.





# WASABI THE BUNNY

**SKILL LEVEL:** \*

**SIZE:** approximately 8 inches (20 cm) tall to the tip of his ears when seated.

**MATERIALS:**

- Worsted weight yarn in green and brown. This example was made with *Vanna's Choice Baby* in Sweet Pea and Taupe.
- Size G-6 (4 mm) crochet hook
- Black safety eyes (12 mm)
- Fiberfill for stuffing
- Stitch marker
- Blunt end tapestry needle
- Ribbon: 3/8 inch (1 cm) wide, about 15 inches (40 cm) long



**HEAD** (in green yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 9:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 10:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 12-16:** sc in all 54 st [54]

**Rnd 17:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 19:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 20:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 21:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 22:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

Fasten off and leave a tail.

**EARS** (in green yarn)

- Rnd 1:** Start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]  
**Rnd 2:** inc 4 times [8]  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [12]  
**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [16]  
**Rnd 5:** sc in all 16 st [16]  
**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [20]  
**Rnd 7:** sc in all 20 st [20]  
**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 4 times [16]  
**Rnd 9:** sc in all 16 st [16]  
**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 4 times [12]  
**Rnd 11-13:** sc in all 12 st [12]  
 Fasten off and leave a tail

**BODY** (in green yarn)

- Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]  
**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]  
**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]  
**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]  
**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]  
**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]  
**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]  
**Rnd 8-10:** sc in all 42 st [42]  
**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]  
**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]  
**Rnd 13-14:** sc in all 30 st [30]  
**Rnd 15:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]  
**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]  
 Fasten off and leave a tail

**FOOT** (make 2, start in brown yarn)

- Row 1:** Chain 5  
**Row 2:** Start in second chain from hook, sc in next 4 st. Turn your piece to start the next row. [4]  
**Row 3:** sc in next 3 st, inc in last st [5]

Put a stitch marker into the 5th stitch. This is your starting stitch as you now continue in the round. (Instead of turning your piece and starting a new row, you will be crocheting in the round) There should be 10 stitches in this first round.

- Rnd 1:** inc in st 2, 5, 7, 10 [14]  
**Rnd 2:** inc in st 2, 7, 10, 14 [18]  
**Rnd 3:** inc in st 3, 8, 12, 18 [22]  
 Change to green yarn.  
**Rnd 4:** sc in all 22 st [22]  
**Rnd 5:** sc in next 8 st, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [19]  
**Rnd 6:** sc in next 6 st, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [16]  
**Rnd 7:** sc in next 5 st, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [13]  
**Rnd 8:** sc in next 4 st, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [10]  
**Rnd 9:** sc, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [7]  
 Stuff the foot (the leg itself does not need stuffing).  
**Rnd 10-14:** sc in all 7 st [7]



**Rnd 15:** dec, sc to end [6]

**Rnd 16-18:** sc in all 6 st [6]

Fasten off and leave a tail.

**ARM** (*make 2, start in brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** Start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]

**Rnd 2:** inc 4 times [8]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [12]

Change to green yarn

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [16]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 4 times [12]

**Rnd 7:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 4 times [8]

At this point, stuff the tip of the arm with fiberfill as it will become harder to do as the arm gets longer.

**Rnd 8:** dec, sc in next 2 st, dec, sc in next 2 st [6]

**Rnd 9-17:** sc in all 6 st [6]

Fasten off and leave a tail

**TAIL** (*in green yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc into a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 4:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 4 times [8]

Fasten off and leave a tail

### ASSEMBLY

- Stuff the head
- Attach the eyes (between round 11 & 12, with 10 stitches between them) and sew the nose with dark brown yarn.
- Attach the ears.
- Stuff the body and attach it to the head.
- Attach the arms.
- Attach the legs.
- Attach the tail (before it is completely sewn on, stuff with a little bit of fiberfill).
- Tie a ribbon around the bunny's neck as you would a necktie. Snip the ends into a point.





# BERNARD THE FOX

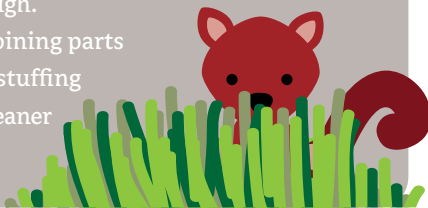

**SKILL LEVEL:** \*\*

**SIZE:** approximately 8 inches (20 cm) long from the tip of the nose to the tail.

**MATERIALS:**

- Light Worsted weight yarn in deep red and white (This sample is made in *Rowan Cotton Glacé*)
- Blue Embroidery Floss
- B-1 to E-4 (2,25 to 3,5 mm) hook. Choose a hook that crochets a tight fabric, with no stuffing showing through.
- Needle for joining parts
- Fiberfill for stuffing
- Craft pipe cleaner



**HEAD** (in red yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6-9:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [25]

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [20]

**Rnd 12:** dec in next 5 st, sc in next 10 st [15]

**Rnd 13-14:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 15:** dec in next 2 st, sc in next 11 st [13]

Stuff with fiberfill.

**Rnd 16:** dec in next 3 st, sc in next 7 st [10]

**Rnd 17:** dec, sc in next 8 st [9]

**Rnd 18:** dec, sc in next 7 st [8]

**Rnd 19:** dec, sc in next 6 st [7]

**Rnd 20:** dec, sc in next 5 st [6]

Add more stuffing.

**Rnd 21:** dec, sc in next 4 st [5]

Fasten off, sew up the tip.

### **EARS** (*make 2 in red yarn*)

Make a chain of 7 stitches [7]

**Row 1:** Start second ch from hook, sc in first st, 2 hdc in next st, 2 dc in next 2 st, 2 hdc in next st, 3 sc in next st, carry on along the other side of the chain, 2 hdc in next st, 2 dc in next 2 st, 2 hdc in next st, sc in last 2 st [22]  
Fasten off, leave enough tail to sew the ear to the head.

### **TAIL** (*start in white yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** sc in next 3 st, inc in next 2 st [7]

**Rnd 3:** sc in next 5 st, inc in next 2 st [9]

**Rnd 4:** sc in next 7 st, inc in next 2 st [11]

**Rnd 5:** sc in next 9 st, inc in next 2 st [13]

**Rnd 6:** Change to red yarn.

sc in next 11 st, inc in next 2 st [15]

**Rnd 7:** sc in next 13 st, inc in next 2 st [17]

**Rnd 8:** sc in next 15 st, inc in next 2 st [19]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 17 st, inc in next 2 st [21]

**Rnd 10:** sc in next 20 st, inc in next st [22]

**Rnd 11-12:** sc in all 22 st [22]

**Rnd 13:** sc in next 18 st, dec in next 2 st [20]

**Rnd 14:** sc in next 16 st, dec in next 2 st [18]

**Rnd 15:** sc in next 14 st, dec in next 2 st [16]

**Rnd 16:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 17:** sc in next 12 st, dec in next 2 st [14]

**Rnd 18:** sc in all 14 st [14]

**Rnd 19:** sc in next 12 st, dec in next st [13]

**Rnd 20:** sc in next 11 st, dec in next st [12]

**Rnd 21:** sc in next 10 st, dec in next st [11]

**Rnd 22:** sc in next 9 st, dec in next st [10]

Stuff with fiberfill.

**Rnd 23:** sc in next 8 st, dec in next st [9]

**Rnd 24:** sc in next 7 st, dec in next st [8]

**Rnd 25:** sc in next 6 st, dec in next st [7]

**Rnd 26:** sc in next 5 st, dec in next st [6]

Fasten off, leave the end open to sew the tail to the body.

### **BODY** (*make in red yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** inc in next 3 st, sc in next 9 st [15]

**Rnd 4:** sc in next 2 st, inc in next 2 st, sc in next 11 st [17]

**Rnd 5-7:** sc in all 17 st [17]

**Rnd 8:** sc in next 3 st, dec in next 2 st, sc in next 10 st [15]

**Rnd 9:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 10:** sc in next 2 st, dec in next 2 st, sc in next 9 st [13]

**Rnd 11:** sc in all 13 st [13]

**Rnd 12:** dec in next 3 st, sc in next 7 st [10]

Stuff with fiberfill.

**Rnd 13:** dec in next 2 st, FLO sc in next 6 st [8]

**Rnd 14:** sc in all 8 st [8]

Fasten off, use the leftover tail to sew to the head.

### **LEGS** (*make 4, start in white yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** sc in all 5 st [5]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 5 st [5]

**Rnd 4:** inc, sc in next 4 st [6]



**Rnd 5:** Change to red yarn, sc in all 6 st [6]

**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all 6 st [6]

**Rnd 8:** inc, sc in next 5 st [7]

**Rnd 9-10:** sc in all 7 st [7]

Fasten off, fold up small pieces of craft pipe cleaner and stuff them inside the legs instead of fiberfill stuffing.

### ASSEMBLING

- Sew the body to the head, positioning the opening over the first round of the head.
- Then sew the tail to the body, make sure the widest part of the tail points down, like in the picture.
- Sew the legs to the body, test the position to check if your Bernard can stand up.
- Sew the ears to the top of the head.
- Secure all loose ends and tuck the loose tails inside the body. Trim off the excess.

– Embroider the nose by overlapping short stitches in a criss-cross pattern to get a layered effect - this will make it raised up.

– Embroider sleepy eyes on either side of the head, or sew on vintage glass eyes for a rustic look.



# DAKOTA THE DOG

by Susan Morishita



## SKILL LEVEL: \*

**SIZE:** Approximately 3 inches (8 cm) tall and wide

## MATERIALS:

- Worsted weight yarn in cream, brown and a small amount of black for the nose.
- Size G-6 (4 mm) crochet hook
- Polyester fiberfill for stuffing
- 2 plastic safety eyes size 9 mm. These can be replaced by small buttons.
- Yarn needle
- Stitch marker



## EYE PATCH (in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

Join with slst to next st. Fasten off, leaving a long end of yarn to later sew the eye patch to the body.

## BODY (in cream yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 8:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 9:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 10:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

Now place the plastic safety eyes. Insert one of the 9 mm safety eyes into the center of the eye patch. Secure it to the body of the dog between rounds 6 and 7. Place the second eye without an eye patch 6 stitches from the first eye. You will sew the eye patch down to the body later.

**Rnd 11:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Stuff the body firmly with fiberfill.

**Rnd 12:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 4 times [8]

**Rnd 13:** Decrease around until you can close. Fasten off and weave the yarn ends into the body with a yarn needle.

After closing the body, sew the eye patch securely to the body. Use a yarn needle and carefully sew around the edges of the eye patch.

**MUZZLE** (*in cream yarn*)

Ch 5

**Rnd 1:** sc in 2nd chain from hook. Sc in next 3 ch.

Continue working around to the other side of the chain.  
inc in all 4 ch [12]

**Rnd 2:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Join with slst to next st. Fasten off, leaving a long end of yarn to sew the muzzle to the body.

With your fingers, shape the muzzle into an oval shape. One side will be more curved than the other. Lightly stuff the muzzle with fiberfill stuffing. Place the

muzzle on the dog's body centered below the eyes with the curved side of the muzzle facing up. Use a yarn needle to carefully sew the muzzle onto the body snug up against the bottom of the eye patch.

**NOSE** (*in black yarn*)

Ch 4

**Row 1:** Sc in second ch from hook. Sc in next 2 ch [3]

Leave a long end of yarn to sew the nose on the muzzle.

Place the nose on top of the muzzle. Using a yarn needle, carefully sew the nose down around the edges.

**EARS** (make 2 in brown yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]**Rnd 3-9:** sc in all 9 st [9]**Rnd 10:** hdc in next st, dc in next 4 st, hdc in next st [6]

Do not finish the round.

Join with a slst to the next st. Fasten off, leaving a long end of yarn to sew the ears to the body.

Do not stuff the ears. Attach the ears to the body. With round 10 of the ears facing up, sew each ear to the body on top of the head.

**PAWS** (make 4, 3 in cream yarn and one in brown yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]**Rnd 3:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 3 times [9]**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all 9 st [9]

Join with slst to next st. Fasten off, leaving a long end of yarn to sew the paws to the body.

Stuff the paws with fiberfill. Sew the paws to the bottom of the body so that the dog will stand up evenly.

**TAIL** (in brown yarn)**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in magic ring [5]**Rnd 2-5:** sc in all 5 st [5]

Join with a slst to the next st. Fasten off, leaving a long end of yarn to sew the tail to the body.

Do not stuff the tail. Place the tail on the center back of the body and sew on.

Dakota is a roly-poly little dog that will fit in the palm of your hand. His long floppy ears fly in the wind as he runs to you on his stumpy little feet.

This is an easy pattern for the beginning crocheter. Dakota doesn't take too much yarn, it is the perfect pattern to use up your yarn remnants. Make a dog that looks like your own, or a friend's and attach a key chain to make the perfect gift!





# NAUGHTY LITTLE MICE

## SKILL LEVEL: \*\*

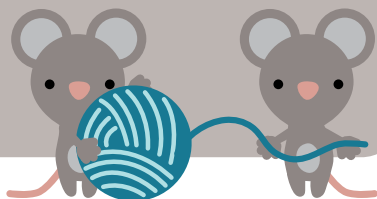

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [12]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [15]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [18]

**Rnd 7-8:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 9:** inc 6 times, sc in next 12 st [24]

**Rnd 10:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times, sc in next 12 st [30]

**Rnd 11-15:** sc in all 30 st [30]

Attach the eyes.

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 17:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 18:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Stuff the head.

**Rnd 19:** dec 6 times, slst [6]

Finish off.

**EAR** (make 2, start in pink yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times, slst [12]

Finish off.

Start the next piece in gray yarn.

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times, slst [12]

**Rnd 3:** Crochet the gray and pink parts together with the pink part in front. Use gray yarn.

(sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times. [15]

Finish off.

**BODY** (in gray yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 6-8:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 9:** (sc in next st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times, sc in next 18 st [27]

**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times, sc in next 18 st [30]

**Rnd 11-19:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 20:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 21:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

Stuff the body.

**Rnd 23:** dec 6 times, slst [6]

Finish off.

**ARM** (make 2 in gray yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** inc in next 3 st, sc in next 9 st [15]

**Rnd 4-6:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 7:** dec in next 3 st, sc in next 9 st [12]

**Rnd 8-20:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Stuff the arm.

**Rnd 21:** dec in next 6 st, slst [6]

Finish off.

**LEG** (make 2, start in pink yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Ch 6, inc in second ch from hook, sc in next 3 st, inc in last ch. Turn and continue on the other side of the chain: sc in next 3 st, inc in last st. [12]

**Rnd 2:** inc 12 times [24]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 4:** Change to gray yarn. sc in all 12 st [24]

**Rnd 5:** sc in next 7 st, dec in next 5 st, sc in next 7 st [19]

**Rnd 6:** sc in next 7 st, dec in next 3 st, sc in next 6 st [16]

**Rnd 7:** sc in next 6 st, dec in next 2 st, sc in next 6 st [14]

**Rnd 8-19:** sc in all 14 st [14]

Stuff the leg.

**Rnd 20:** dec 7 times [7]

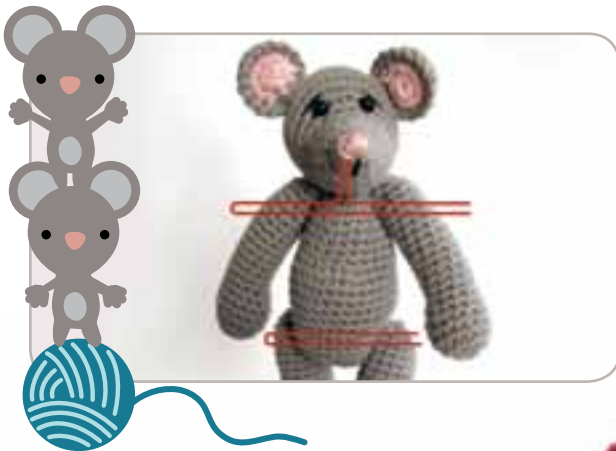
**Rnd 21:** dec 2 times [5]

Finish off.

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 9 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times,  
slst [66]

**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 10 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times,  
slst [72]

Finish off.

#### **CREAM 1** (in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Begin in Part 1, round 9, FLO 3 sc in all 48 st,  
slst [144] Finish off.

#### **CREAM 2** (in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Begin in Part 2, round 5, FLO 3 sc in all 72 st,  
slst [216] Finish off.

#### **ASSEMBLING THE CHOCOLATE CAKE**

Crochet the Bottom round 12 and Part 2 round 14 together as follows:

Use white yarn. sc in each st around, slst [72]

Stuff before you close.

Continue crocheting in white yarn.

4 sc in all 72 st, slst. [288]

Finish off and sew in all ends.

#### **BERRIES**

**RASPBERRY** (in red yarn, make 7 or as many as you wish)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [12]

**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 6:** BLO (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 9 st, slst. [9]

Finish off.

#### **ASSEMBLING THE RASPBERRY**

Pull the thread from round 7 through the raspberry.

**BLUEBERRY** (in blue yarn, make 4 or as many as you wish)

**Rnd 1:** Start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]

**Rnd 2:** inc 4 times [8]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 8 st [8]

**Rnd 4:** dec 4 times, slst [4]

Finish off.

**LEAVES** (in green yarn, make 4 or as many as you wish)

**Rnd 1:** (Ch 5, sc in second ch from hook, hdc in next 2 st,  
sc in next st) repeat 2 times.

Finish off.

#### **ASSEMBLING THE BLUEBERRY**

– Sew the blueberry to the leaves.

– Sew the raspberries and blueberries to the chocolate cake.

– Sew in all ends.



# ROARY THE TIGER

**SKILL LEVEL:** \*

**SIZE:** Approximately 5 inches (13 cm) tall.

**MATERIALS:**

- Worsted weight yarn in orange, white, pink and black. This model is created with *Lily Sugar 'n Cream's 100% cotton yarn* in mango and white, *Paton's Classic Wool* in pink, and *Peaches 'n Cream's 100% cotton yarn* in black.
- Size E-4 (3,50 mm) crochet hook
- Two 6 mm safety eyes with plastic washers
- fiberfill for stuffing
- Yarn needle for finishing

**NOTE:** The *invisible decrease* method is used in this pattern, abbreviated as *dec*. You can find the tutorial for this stitch in the front of the book.



**HEAD** (in orange yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (inc, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8:** (inc, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 9:** (inc, sc in next 7 st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 10:** (inc, sc in next 8 st) repeat 6 times [60]

**Rnd 11:** (inc, sc in next 9 st) repeat 6 times [66]

**Rnd 12:** (inc, sc in next 10 st) repeat 6 times [72]

**Rnd 13:** (inc, sc in next 11 st) repeat 6 times [78]

**Rnd 14:** (inc, sc in next 12 st) repeat 6 times [84]

**Rnd 15:** sc in all 84 st [84]

**Rnd 16:** Mark the first stitch of this round for later reference. (dec, sc in next 12 st) repeat 6 times [78]

**Rnd 17:** (dec, sc in next 11 st) repeat 6 times [72]

**Rnd 18:** (dec, sc in next 10 st) repeat 6 times [66]

**Rnd 19:** (dec, sc in next 9 st) repeat 6 times [60]

Insert the safety eyes:

Refer back to the stitch you marked in round 16. Count 4 stitches to the left of the marked stitch. Insert one safety eye into that spot between rounds 15 and 16. Then count 19 stitches to the left of that eye and insert the other safety eye between rounds 15 and 16. Secure the safety eyes by fastening the washers. Continue crocheting.

**Rnd 20:** (dec, sc in next 8 st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 21:** (dec, sc in next 7 st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 22:** (dec, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [42]

Begin stuffing the head with fiberfill, and continue stuffing as you go.

**Rnd 23:** (dec, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 24:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 25:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 26:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 27:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 28:** dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off and leave a 6 inch (15 cm) tail. Use the tail to sew the head shut, and then hide the rest of the tail by weaving it into the head.

**MUZZLE** (in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]



**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]

Slip stitch into the next stitch, fasten off and leave a 16 inch (40 cm) tail for sewing.

**EARS** (make 2, start in orange yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Leave a 6 inch (15 cm) leading tail for sewing.

Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

Change to black yarn.

**Rnd 4:** sc in next 14 st [14]

Fasten off and leave a 36 inch (90 cm) tail for sewing (and for making the tiger's stripes).

**BODY** (in orange yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** sc in next 24 st [24]

**Rnd 6:** (dec in next st, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 8:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 12 st [12]

Slst into the next stitch, fasten off and leave a 16 inch (40 cm) tail for sewing. Stuff the body with fiberfill.

**ARMS** (make 2, start in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 5:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 6:** dec 6 times [6]

Change to orange yarn.

**Rnds 7-12:** Sc in next 6 st [6]

Slst into the next stitch, fasten off and leave a 12 inch (30 cm) tail for sewing. Stuff the paws (white portion) with fiberfill.

**LEGS** (*make 2, start in white yarn*)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]**Rnd 6:** sc in all 30 st [30]**Rnd 7:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 8:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 9:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Change to orange yarn.

**Rnds 10-12:** sc in next 12 st [12]

Slst into the next stitch, fasten off and leave a 12 inch (30 cm) tail for sewing. Stuff paws (white portion) with fiberfill.

**TAIL** (*start in black yarn*)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** sc in all 6 st [6]

Change to orange yarn.

**Rnds 3-9:** sc in all 6 st [6]

Slst into the next stitch, fasten off and leave a 6 inch (15 cm) tail for sewing. Stuff with fiberfill.

**ASSEMBLY****Step 1: Muzzle.**

Pick up the white muzzle you crocheted. Thread the pink yarn onto your yarn needle. Starting from the back side of the muzzle, create a nose by inserting your needle up through the center of round 1, then into a space between the stitches of round 4 and 5, then come back out

through the center of round 1 and go into another space between round 4 and 5. Repeat this motion until the arch of your tiger's nose spans about 9 stitches wide and no white shows in between the pink yarn. Cut off and hide any excess yarn on the back side of the muzzle.

Use black yarn to create a mouth in the shape of the letter U. The mouth can be placed off center on top of two stitches in round 4. Cut off and hide any excess yarn on the back side of the muzzle.

Use the white yarn tail to sew the completed muzzle between the tiger's eyes. Hide the loose yarn tail when finished.

### Step 2: Ears and stripes

Using a yarn needle, attach both ears to the head. Use the orange yarn tails to attach the orange portion of the ears to the head, and use the black yarn tails to attach the black portion of the ears to the head. When the ears are

attached, use the extra-long black yarn tail to create three stripes on the left and right sides of the tiger's head.

### Step 3: Body

Center the opening of the body around round 28 of the head (this is the bottom of the head). Sew them together.

### Step 4: Arms

Align the arms vertically with the muzzle. Attach the arms where the head meets the body, and then sew the length of the arms to the length of the body.

### Step 5: Legs

Position and sew on the legs. Make sure that the tiger can sit properly.

### Step 6: Tail

When the tiger is in the sitting position, center the tail on its buttocks. The length of the tail should be resting on the ground to give the tiger more base support.





# JOHNNY THE MONKEY

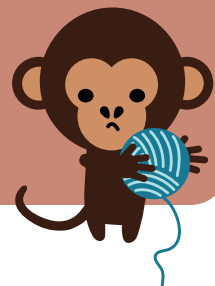
**SKILL LEVEL:** \*\*\*

**SIZE:** Approximately 6 inches (15 cm) tall when seated.

**MATERIALS:**

- Sport weight yarn in brown and yellow.
- Size B-1 (2.5 mm) crochet hook
- Fiberfill for stuffing
- A pair of 8 mm black eyes
- Stitch marker
- A long tapestry needle
- Sewing pins

**NOTE:** The *invisible decrease* method is used in this pattern, abbreviated as *dec*. You can find the tutorial for this stitch in the front of the book.



**HEAD** (*in brown yarn*)

Starting at the front of the head.

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 9:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [60]

**Rnd 11-16:** sc in all 60 st [60]

**Rnd 17:** (sc in next 8 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 19:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 20:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 21:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 22:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

Put a little bit of stuffing into the head. Continue to add stuffing after the next two rounds so the head is firmly stuffed when finished.



**Rnd 23:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 24:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 25:** dec 6 times [6]

Cut the yarn and pull it through the last loop. With a tapestry needle, weave the tail through the front loops of the remaining 6 stitches and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end.

#### **HEAD PATCH** (in yellow yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times, sc in last 15 st [33]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 5 st, (sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in next st, slst in next 5 st, (sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc) in next st, sc in last 21 st [41]

**Rnd 10:** sc in next 7 st, inc, sc in next 2 st, dec, sc, dec, sc in next 2 st, inc, sc in last 23 st [41]

Fasten off leaving a tail long enough to sew to the head.

#### **BODY** (in brown yarn)

Starting at the top of the body.

**Rnd 1:** Start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** inc 5 times [10]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [20]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 20 st [20]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [25]

**Rnd 9:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [30]

**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [35]

**Rnd 11-16:** sc in all 35 st [35]

**Rnd 17:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [30]

**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [25]

**Rnd 19:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [20]

**Rnd 20:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [15]



Add some fiberfill to the neck area and the body.

Finish stuffing after the next round.

**Rnd 21:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [10]

**Rnd 22:** dec 5 times [5]

Cut the yarn and pull it through the last loop. With a tapestry needle, weave the tail through the front loops of the remaining 5 stitches and pull it tight to close.

Weave in the yarn end.

**EAR** (make 2 in yellow yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** inc 5 times [10]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [20]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 20 st [20]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 7:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [10]

Fasten off leaving a tail long enough to sew to the head.

**ARM** (make 2, start in yellow yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [15]

**Rnd 4-6:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 7:** dec 3 times, sc in next 9 st [12]

Change to brown yarn.

**Rnd 8-19:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Stuff the arm.

**Rnd 20:** dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off.

With a tapestry needle, weave the tail through the front loops of the remaining 6 stitches and pull it tight to close. Weave in the yarn end.

**LEG** (*make 2, start in yellow yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** ch 6, sc in second ch from hook and in each of next 3 ch, 3 sc in last ch from hook.

Working on the underside of the foundation chain, sc in next 3 ch, inc in last ch [12]

**Rnd 2:** inc, sc in next 3 st, inc in next 3 st, sc in next 3 st, inc in last 2 st [18]

**Rnd 3:** Sc in next st, inc in next st, sc in next 4 st, inc in next st, sc in next 3 st, inc, sc in next 5 st, inc, sc in last st [22]

**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all 22 st [22]

**Rnd 6:** sc in next 6 st, dec in next 2 st, sc in next 2 st, dec in next 2 st, sc in next 6 st [18]

**Rnd 7:** sc in next 5 st, dec in next 4 st, sc in next 5 st [14]  
Stuff the foot.

Change to brown yarn.

**Rnd 8-19:** sc in all 14 st [14]

**Rnd 20:** dec 7 times [7]

Stuff the bottom part of the leg leaving the upper part empty. Fasten off.

With a tapestry needle, weave the tail through the front loops of the remaining 7 stitches and pull it tight to close.

**TAIL** (*in brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

Stuff as you go along.

**Rnds 3-39:** Sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 40:** dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off.

With a tapestry needle, weave the tail through the front loops of the remaining 6 stitches and pull it tight to close. Press the tail with your fingers to shape it so it's not straight but curved at the end.

## ASSEMBLING AND FINISHING

After you made all the parts, you may want to pin them together to see how they fit together.

### Step 1: Finishing the head

– If you're using safety eyes, attach them to the patch before sewing it to the head. Attach them to Rnd 9 of the patch (where you made sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc).

– Sew the patch between Rnd 7 and 8 of the head. Pin it first to make sure it's centered and then sew. Sew 3/4, stuff firmly and finish sewing.

– Embroider a small semicircle for the mouth. Use brown yarn and a tapestry needle and make it between the first and second round of the head patch using stem stitch. For 'baby' look (like pictured here) leave it without a mouth.

– If you're using sew-on eyes, place the eyes on round 9 of the head patch. Insert them exactly into the stitch in which you made the cluster of sc, hdc, dc, hdc, sc. Sew them using a long needle and yellow yarn. Insert the needle through the bottom of the patch (leaving a tail for securing), coming out on the spot where the first eye should be, through the eye, back through the same spot and then coming out where the second eye should be, through the eye and then back to the bottom of the head patch to be secured. The needle should come out on exactly the same place as where you inserted it.



Tie a strong knot or a surgeon's knot. (To make a surgeon's knot, make a knot as usually, but loop the yarn one more time before tightening.) Hide the ends inside the head.

– With yarn ends, sew the ears to the head so that the upper edges of the ears are a little bit above the eyes. Sew them 2 rows away from the head patch.

### Step 2: Sewing the head to the body

– Experiment with the position of the head. Pin it to the body and see which position you like best.  
– Use a tapestry needle and brown yarn to sew the head into position. Sew it to the third round of the body.

*TIP: If the head is not very stable (dangles from one side to another) double sew it to the body for more stability. You can even sew it to a lower round of the body (round 4), or sew one side of the head to a lower round leaning the head slightly to that side.*

### Step 3: Attaching the arms

– (see picture below) With a long tapestry needle and brown yarn, leaving a long tail for securing, insert the needle into the top, inner side of the arm and through to the outside. Insert the needle one stitch away from the place it came out, back through the arm, through the body (between round 7 and 8 of the body) and through



the second arm to the other side. On the way back, again take the needle one stitch away from the place it came out, through the arm and again through the body.

– Take the two yarn ends and knot them together. Use at least 2 tight knots. Go several times through the body with yarn ends to secure and to hide them.

### Step 4: Attaching the legs

Sew the legs to the bottom of the body with a tapestry needle and brown yarn.

### Step 5: Attaching the tail

Sew round 39 of the tail to the center back bottom of the body over round 16 - 20.



# LEILA THE PONY

by Lilleliis (Mari-Liis Lille)



## SKILL LEVEL: \*\*

**SIZE:** Approximately 10 inches (26 cm) tall when sitting.

## MATERIALS:

- Worsted Weight yarn in beige, pink and brown. This example is crocheted with *Hjertegarn Lima*.
- Size E-4 (3.5 mm) crochet hook
- Fiberfill for stuffing
- Safety eyes (diameter 21 mm)
- White cotton yarn for making eye patches
- Cotton fabric for embellishing the ears
- Thread for making the nose, mouth and eye-lashes and for sewing on the fabric details
- Darning and embroidery needles
- Stitch marker
- Satin ribbon (8 inch - 20 cm)



## EYE PATCH (make 2 in white yarn)

Start 10 hdc in a magic ring. Slst in the first hdc.

Important! When pulling the round together leave enough space for the safety eye.

Ch 3. Slst in the third st from hook. Sc in next 3 st, 2 hdc in next 2 st, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, hdc in next st, sc in next 2 st, slst into the first ch of the starting chain.

Leave a long yarn tail and cut the yarn. With the help of the darning needle pull the yarn through the top st of the piece. Stick the eyes into the holes of the patches and leave them aside (Do not fasten the eyes, we will come to that part later on).

## HEAD (in beige yarn)

Crocheted from front to back.

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring. [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8-10:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 12-14:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 15:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [60]

**Rnd 17-26** sc in all 60 st [60]

Now it is time to fasten the safety eyes. Find round 18 and 19. Insert the first eye between them, then count 17 holes to the left and insert the second eye in the next hole. Before closing the washers pull the shorter yarn tails inside the work. Make sure the eye patches are parallel, the angles of the eyes directed towards the nose.

**Rnd 27:** (sc in next 8 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 28:** sc in all 54 st [54]

**Rnd 29:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 30:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 31:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]



**Rnd 32:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 33:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

Fill about half of the head. Add stuffing as the work progresses and make sure it is filled quite heavily.

**Rnd 34:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 35:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 36:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 37:** dec 6 times [6]

Close the hole by leading the yarn through all 6 st, pull tight.

Find the closest hole to the angle of the eye and lead the yarn through with the help of the darning needle. If you wish, you may sew down the edges of the eye patch using the yarn tail you left for it.

Also stitch the nose, mouth and eyelashes.



**EAR** (make 2 in beige yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** sc in all 6 st [6]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 4:** sc in all 9 st [9]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [12]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [15]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 3 times [18]

**Rnd 8-11:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 12:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Take the fabric. Cut out the patches with the desired shape and sew them on the ears. Using the long yarn tail sew the ears on the head.

**BODY** (in beige yarn)

Crocheted from the bottom up.

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 9:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [60]

**Rnd 11-16:** sc in all 60 st [60]

**Rnd 17:** (sc in next 8 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [54]



**Rnd 18:** Sc in all 54 st [54]

**Rnd 19:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 20-21:** Sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 22:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 23-24:** Sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 25:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 26-27:** Sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 28:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 29-30:** Sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 31:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 32:** Sc in all 24 st [24]

Fill the body tightly with fiberfill.

Sew the head and body together.

### **MANE** (in pink yarn)

Cut a piece of yarn of about 20 inch (50 cm) long and fold it in half. Find a proper place where you want to start the hair and stick the hook through the holes, take the yarn strip on the hook and bring up a loop. Now bring the hook through the loop, take both yarn strips on it and pull through. Moving from the front side of the head to the back side, stick the hook through the next hole and work the same way. Continue this method until the mane has the preferred length. You may add rows in width to give it more density (in this example the mane is made in four rows).

### **ARM** (make 2, start in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7-8:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 7 st, (dec in next st, sc in next 2 st) repeat 5 times, inc, sc in next 7 st [30]

**Rnd 10:** Change to beige yarn. sc in next 7 st, (dec in next st, sc in next st) repeat 5 times, inc, sc in next 6 st [24]

**Rnd 11:** sc in all 24 st [24]



**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 3 times [21]

**Rnd 13:** sc in all 21 st [21]

**Rnd 14:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 3 times [18]

**Rnd 15-16:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 17:** sc in next 8 st, dec in next st, sc in next 8 st [17]

**Rnd 18-19:** sc in all 17 st [17]

**Rnd 20:** sc in next 15 st, dec in next st [16]

**Rnd 21-22:** sc in all 16 st [16]

Fill the arm with fiberfill.

Do not add any stuffing hereafter.

**Rnd 23:** sc in next 7 st, dec in next st, sc in next 7 st [15]

**Rnd 24:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 25:** sc in next 13 st, dec in next st [14]

**Rnd 26:** sc in all 14 st [14]

**Rnd 27:** sc in next 6 st, dec in next st, sc in next 6 st [13]

**Rnd 28:** sc in all 13 st [13]

**Rnd 29:** sc in next 11 st, dec in next st [12]

**Rnd 30:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Leave a long yarn tail for sewing and cut the yarn.

**LEG** (*make 2, start in brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7-8:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 7 st, (dec in next st, sc in next 2 st) repeat 5 times, dec in next st, sc in next 7 st [30]

**Rnd 10:** Change to beige yarn. sc in next 7 st, (dec in next st, sc in next st) repeat 5 times, dec in next st, sc in next 6 st [24]

**Rnd 11:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 3 times [21]

**Rnd 13:** sc in all 21 st [21]

Fill the leg and continue adding the stuffing as the work progresses. You will have the best result if you stuff the upper part of the leg slightly softer.

**Rnd 14:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 3 times [18]

**Rnd 15-16:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 17:** sc in next 8 st, dec in next st, sc in next 8 st [17]

**Rnd 18-19:** sc in all 17 st [17]

**Rnd 20:** sc in next 15 st, dec in next st [16]

**Rnd 21-22:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 23:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 4 times [12]



Leave a long yarn tail for sewing and cut the yarn. Sew the legs and arms to the body. If you want your pony to sit properly, you should attach the legs more to the front and quite spread out. Attach the arms rather high, but not quite between the neck.

**TAIL** (*in pink yarn*)

Cut 10 pieces of yarn of about 10 inches (25 cm) long. Find a proper place for the tail and make it using the same method as with the mane.

Tie a nice satin ribbon around the tail.

Finish your pony by cutting the mane and tail.

You may try some haircut or just even out the ends.



# LIL QUACK THE DUCK

## SKILL LEVEL: \*\*

**SIZE:** approximately 6 inches (15 cm) tall without his hat.

## MATERIALS:

- Worsted weight yarn in white, blue and orange. This example was made with *Vanna's Choice* in white and silver blue and *TLC Essentials* in Sandstone.
- Size G-6 (4 mm) crochet hook
- Black safety eyes (9 mm)
- Polyester fiberfill for stuffing
- Stitch marker
- Blunt end tapestry needle



## HEAD (in white yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** Sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 9:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 10-11:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 13-14:** sc in all 54 st [54]

**Rnd 15:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 16:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 17:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) and repeat [36]

**Rnd 19:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) and repeat [30]

**Rnd 20:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) and repeat [24]

**Rnd 21:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) and repeat [18]

Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.

**DUCK BILL** (*in orange yarn*)**Row 1:** chain 6**Row 2:** Start in second ch from hook, sc in next 5 st and turn. [5]**Row 3:** sc in next 4 st, inc in last st [6]

Now put a stitch marker into the very last stitch you made. This is now stitch #1 as you continue in the round. There should be 12 stitches in this first round.

**Rnd 1-2:** Sc in all 12 st [12]

Fasten off and leave a tail for attaching.

**HAT** (*Start in blue yarn*)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 4:** sc in all 18 st [18]**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 6:** sc in all 24 st [24]**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]**Rnd 8:** sc in all 30 st [30]**Rnd 9:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]**Rnd 10:** sc in all 36 st [36]

Change to white yarn.

**Rnd 11:** sc in all 36 st [36]

Weave in all yarn ends neatly.

Take your hat and poke the top in with your finger.

Flip it upside down and you will have a cute little sailor hat. The brim will have the white edging.

**BODY** (*in white yarn*)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]**Rnd 6:** sc in all 30 st [30]**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]**Rnd 9-10:** sc in all 42 st [42]**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]**Rnd 12:** sc in all 48 st [48]**Rnd 13:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) and repeat [42]**Rnd 14:** sc in all 42 st [42]**Rnd 15:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]**Rnd 17:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 19-20:** sc in all 18 st [18]

Fasten off

**SAILOR SHAWL (MAIN BODY)** (*Start in blue yarn*)**Row 1:** chain 14**Row 2-5:** Start in second ch from hook, sc in next 13 st and turn. [13]

Change to white yarn.

**Row 6** sc in all 13 st [13]

Weave in all ends.





### SHAWL (ARMS) *(make 2 in blue yarn)*

**Row 1:** chain 19

**Row 2:** Start in second ch from hook, sc in next 18 st and turn. [18]

**Row 3:** sc in next 6 st, bind off and weave in.

### WING *(in white yarn)*

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 5:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 6:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 4 times [8]

Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.

### FOOT *(in orange yarn)*

**Row 1:** chain 5

**Row 2:** Start in second ch from hook, sc in all 4 st. Turn your piece. [4]

**Row 3:** sc in next 3 st, inc in last st [5]

Now put a stitch marker into the last stitch you made.

This is going to be st #1 as you now continue in the round. There should be 10 stitches in the first round.

**Rnd 1:** inc in stitches 2, 5, 7, 10 [14]

**Rnd 2:** inc in stitches 2, 7, 10, 14 [18]

**Rnd 3:** inc in stitches 4, 8, 12, 18 [22]

**Rnd 4:** sc in all 22 st [22]

**Rnd 5:** sc in next 9 st, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [19]

**Rnd 6:** sc in next 7 st, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [16]

**Rnd 7:** sc in next 6 st, dec, sc, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [13]

**Rnd 8:** sc in next 7 st, dec, sc, dec, sc to end [11]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 2 st, dec, sc in next 2 st, dec, sc in next 2 st [9]

**Rnd 10:** sc in all 9 st [9]

Fasten off and leave a tail for sewing.

### ASSEMBLY

- Stuff the head.
- Position the eyes.
- Attach the duck bill.
- Affix the backings onto the safety eyes.
- Stuff the body.
- Attach the head to the body.
- Attach each arm of the shawl to the main body of the shawl (the side with the shorter row faces out).
- Attach the wings.
- Attach the feet.
- Tie the shawl around the neck.



# LEVI THE BABY BEAR

by Josephine Wu  
(A Morning Cup of Jo Creations)



**SKILL LEVEL:** \*

**SIZE:** approximately 4 inches (10 cm) tall.

**MATERIALS:**

- Worsted weight yarn in brown. For this model *Lily Sugar 'n Cream's 100% cotton yarn* in warm brown was used.
- E-4 (3,50 mm) crochet hook
- Two 6 mm safety eyes with plastic washers
- One 15 mm safety nose with plastic washer
- Fiberfill for stuffing
- Craft felt for bear's snout
- Fabric glue
- Yarn needle for finishing

**NOTE:** The *invisible decrease* method is used in this pattern, abbreviated as *dec*. You can find the tutorial for this stitch in the front of the book.



**Preparation:** Cut an oval shape out of the craft felt in the color of your choice. The oval should be about 1 inch (2,5cm) tall and 1.5 inches (4 cm) long. Then, holding the oval so that the length is horizontal, cut a tiny slit right above the middle of the oval to insert the safety nose. Do not fasten the washer until instructed to do so.

**HEAD** (*in brown yarn*)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]**Rnd 6:** (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [36]**Rnd 7:** (inc, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [42]**Rnd 8:** (inc, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [48]**Rnd 9:** (inc, sc in next 7 st) repeat 6 times [54]**Rnd 10:** (inc, sc in next 8 st) repeat 6 times [60]**Rnd 11:** (inc, sc in next 9 st) repeat 6 times [66]**Rnd 12:** sc in all 66 st [66]**Rnd 13:** dec, sc in next 9 st, dec, sc,

Use a stitch marker to mark the space between the last two stitches you just made (this will be the location of the nose).

sc in next 8 st, (dec, sc in next 9 st) repeat 4 times [60]

**Rnd 14:** (dec, sc in next 8 st) repeat 6 times [54]**Rnd 15:** (dec, sc in next 7 st) repeat 6 times [48]**Rnd 16:** (dec, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [42]

Work on face: Insert the 15 mm nose into the spot marked in round 13, making sure that the nose is inserted between round 13 & 14. From the right-hand edge of the snout, count 3 sts to the right. Insert the eye in the space above the third st (between round 12 & 13). Place the left eye by counting 3 st to the left of the left-hand edge of the snout, and then check that both eyes are evenly spaced from the nose. Once satisfied with the placement, make sure the felt pieces are in place before fastening the washers. Secure the eyes and nose by fastening the washers.

Continue crocheting the head.

**Rnd 17:** (dec, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [36]**Rnd 18:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [30]**Rnd 19:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 20:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 21:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]**Rnd 22:** dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off and leave a 6 inch (15 cm) tail. Use the tail to sew the head shut, and then hide the rest of the tail in the head. Use fabric glue to fasten the felt snout in place.

**EARS** (*make 2 in brown yarn*)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]**Rnd 3:** sc in all 12 st [12]**Rnd 4:** dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off and leave a 12 inch (30 cm) tail. The ears do not need to be stuffed. Use the tail to sew the ears to the head and then hide the rest of the tail in the head.

**BODY** (*in brown yarn*)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]**Rnd 5:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 6:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 8:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 9:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Fasten off and leave a 12 inch (30 cm) tail for sewing.

Stuff the body with fiberfill. Position and sew the body to the head, centering the open portion of the body around round 22 of the head.

**ARMS** (make 2 *in brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** dec 6 times [6]

**Rnd 4-7:** sc in all 6 st [6]

Fasten off and leave a 12 inch (30 cm) tail for sewing.

The arms do not need to be stuffed. Sew the arms shut, then position and sew the arms to each side of the body.

**LEGS** (make 2 *in brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 6:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 7:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 8&9:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Fasten off and leave a 12 inch (30 cm) tail for sewing.

Stuff the legs with fiberfill. Position and sew the legs to the body. Make sure the legs are sewn on so that the bear can sit without falling over.

**BEAR TAIL** (*in brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

Fasten off and leave a 6 inch (15 cm) tail for sewing.

Sew the tail onto the back of the body.

**ASSEMBLY**

All pieces should be securely sewn together. Hide all loose yarn tails by weaving them inside the body.





# EDUARDO THE DONKEY

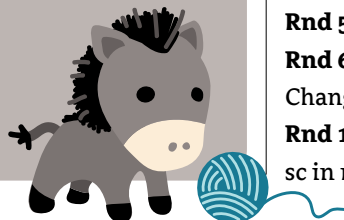

- Light Worsted weight yarn in grey, ecru, black, light green, dark green, brown and red.

- 12 mm plastic safety eyes
- Fiberfill for stuffing
- Size C (3 mm) crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- Optional: two marbles



**HEAD** (start in ecru yarn)

**Rnd 1:** ch 2, 6 sc in second ch from hook [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc in all 6 st [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6-10:** sc in all 30 st [30]

Change to gray yarn.

**Rnd 11:** sc in next 12 st, inc in next 6 st, sc in next 12 st [36]

**Rnd 12:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 13:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 14:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 15:** sc in all 54 st [54]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [60]

**Rnd 17-20:** sc in all 60 st [60]

Attach the eyes between round 15 and 16 with an interspace of 19 st.

**Rnd 21:** sc in all 60 st [60]

**Rnd 22:** (sc in next 8 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 23:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 24:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 25-26:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 27:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 28:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 29:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 30:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

Stuff the head

**Rnd 31:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 32:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 33:** dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Sew two nostrils with black yarn at the height of round 4 with an interspace of 6 st.

**EARS** (*make 2 in gray yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** ch 2, 5 sc in second ch from hook [5]

**Rnd 2:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 2 times, sc in last st [7]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 3 times, sc in last st [10]

**Rnd 4:** sc in all 10 st [10]

**Rnd 5:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 6:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [20]

**Rnd 8-10:** sc in all 20 st [20]

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 8 st, dec in next st) repeat 2 times [18]

**Rnd 12:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 13:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 14-15:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Fasten off. Don't stuff the ears and sew them at the height of round 21 of the head with an interspace of 12 st.

**BODY** (*start in gray yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** ch 2, 6 sc in next ch from hook [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8-9:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 11-17:** sc in all 48 st [48]

Change color. Continue in stripe pattern starting with dark green. For a stripe pattern crochet 2 rounds



in dark green (*dark*), followed by 2 rounds in light green (*light*).

**Rnd 18-19:** (*dark*) sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 20-21:** (*light*) sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 22-23:** (*dark*) sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 24:** (*light*) sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 25:** (*light*) (sc 6, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 26-27:** (*dark*) Sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 28:** (*light*) (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 29:** (*light*) (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 30:** (*dark*) (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

Stuff the body.

**Rnd 31:** (*dark*) (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 32:** (*light*) (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 33:** (*light*) dec 6 times [6]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

*Optional: crochet an edge of sc on the colour changes. This way it will look more like he's actually wearing pants.*

#### **NECK** (*in gray yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** ch 30, join to make a ring with a slst

**Rnd 2:** sc in all 30 st on the ring. Be careful not to twist the stitches [30]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 30 st [30]

Fasten off. First you sew the neck onto the body, between round 4 and 15. After this you attach the head onto the neck. Stuff the neck at the last moment before closing the gap. Make sure the neck is firmly stuffed.

#### **LEGS** (*make 4, start in black yarn*)

All four legs are the same. Only the hind legs have an extra color change so it looks like Eduardo is wearing pants.

**Rnd 1:** ch 2, 6 sc in next ch from hook [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]





**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** BLO (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 6-7:** sc in all 18 st [18]

Change to gray yarn.

**Rnd 8-10:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 11:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 2 times [16]

*FOR HIND LEGS ONLY:*

*Change color continue with dark green.*

**Rnd 12-13:** sc in all 16 st [16]

Fasten off. To make sure Eduardo stands up, put a marble in each hind leg. Stuff the legs firmly. Attach the legs under the body so that Eduardo can stand up.

**MANE** (in fuzzy black yarn)

**Row 1:** ch 5. Turn your work

**Row 2:** ch 1, start in the second ch from hook.  
sc in next 5 st

Repeat this last row until your piece measures 5 inch (12 cm). Attach it so that it starts between the ears and ends just before the color changes of the body.

**HAT** (in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** ch 2, 6 sc in next ch from hook [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** BLO (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 2 times [16]

**Rnd 5-6:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 4 times [20]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [25]

Fasten off. Stuff the hat lightly and sew the hat in place between the ears on top of the head. Sew some red yarn around the base of the hat.

**TAIL** (in grey yarn)

**Rnd 1:** ch 6. Fasten off. Tie small pieces of fuzzy black yarn in the last ch. Sew the tail in place onto the last row of the body.



# RECO THE PIG

by Airali Handmade

**SKILL LEVEL:** \*\*\*

**SIZE:** approximately 4.5 inches (12 cm) tall.

**MATERIALS:**

- Sport weight yarn in pink and blue.
- Size B-1 (2,5 mm) crochet hook
- Black yarn
- Beads (or safety eyes) size 5 mm
- 2 decorative buttons size 12 mm (0,5 inch)
- Fiberfill for stuffing

**HEAD** (in pink yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (inc, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8-12:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 13:** (inc, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 14-16:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 17:** (dec, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 18:** (dec, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 19:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 20:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 21:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]



**Rnd 22:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Fill the head.

**Rnd 23:** dec 6 times.

Leave a 4 inch (10 cm) tail and finish off.

With black yarn sew the eyes between round 13 and 14 spaced by 7 stitches.

Sew the eyebrows at round 11. (length 3 stitches).

#### **LEGS AND BODY** (in pink yarn)

Start with the first leg.

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** inc 5 times [10]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 4/8:** sc in all 15 st [15].

Create a second leg just like the first. Don't cut the thread, instead join the two legs with a slst and continue working the body.

**Rnd 9-11:** 1 sc in each st [30]

**Rnd 12:** (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 13-17:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 18:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 19:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 20:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]



**Rnd 21:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 22:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Fill the body and legs. Leave a tail of 8 inch (20cm) and sew the body to the head.

#### **ARMS** (make 2 in pink yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3-7:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Fill the arms. Leave a tail of 6 inch (15cm) and sew the limbs between round 15 and 18 of the body.

**EARS** (make 2 in pink yarn)

Ch5. sc and hdc in second chain from hook. 3 dc in next st. hdc and sc in next st. Slst in the last st, leave a 4 inch (10cm) tail and sew the ears between round 6 and 8 of the head.

**MUZZLE** (in pink yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** inc 5 times [10]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all 15 st [15].

Leave a tail of 6 inch (15cm) and sew the muzzle between round 15 and 19 of the head.

**DUNGAREES** (in blue yarn)

Begin with trousers legs (make 2).

**Rnd 1:** Start 18 ch, slst in first chain. Work 18 sc around and continue to work in a spiral.



**Rnd 2-3:** sc in all 18 st [18].

Make a second piece. At the end of the second leg don't cut the thread, join the trousers legs with a slst and continue working the body of the dungaree.

**Rnd 4:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 6-9:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 10:** sc in next 18 st and begin to create the flap of the dungaree continuing with sc in next 9 st. Stop working in a continuous spiral, start working in rows. Turn the work and repeat (sc in next 9 st) for 3 rows.

Begin the first shoulder strap:

Ch 19, attach with a slst on the 36th st of round 9. sc in next 18 ch. When returned to the front of the dungaree, sc in 9 st on the flap of the dungaree.

Begin the second shoulder strap:

Ch 19, attach with a slst on the 6th st of round 9. sc in next 18 ch. Leave a tail of 6 in (15 cm) to attach the shoulder strap to the dungaree and sew the buttons.





# MORTON THE MOOSE

by Footloosefriend

**SKILL LEVEL:** \*

**SIZE:** approximately 8 inches (20 cm) tall.

**MATERIALS:**

- Worsted weight yarn in dark brown, light brown and black
- Size F (3,75 mm) crochet hook
- 12 mm safety eyes
- Yarn needle
- Pipe Cleaners are optional



**EYES** (*make 2 in dark brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 3 times [6] (not a complete round)

Tie off, leave a tail for attaching to the head.

Attach eyes through the middle of the loop.

Attach to the body before you finish stuffing it.

**BODY** (*in dark brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 9-15:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 16:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 17:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 19-21:** sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 22:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 23:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 24:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 25:** (sc in next 7 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

**Rnd 26-30:** sc in all 54 st [54]

**Rnd 31:** (sc in next 8 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [60]

**Rnd 32:** (sc in next 9 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [66]

**Rnd 33:** (sc in next 10 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [72]

**Rnd 34:** sc in all 72 st [72]

**Rnd 35:** (sc in next 11 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [78]

**Rnd 36-42:** sc in all 78 st [78]

**Rnd 43:** (sc in next 11 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [72]

**Rnd 44:** (sc in next 10 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [66]

**Rnd 45:** (sc in next 9 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [60]

**Rnd 46:** (sc in next 8 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [54]

Begin stuffing and stuff as you go.

**Rnd 47:** (sc in next 7 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [48]

**Rnd 48:** (sc in next 6 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 49:** (sc in next 5 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 50:** (sc in next 4 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 51:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 52:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 53:** (sc in next st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 54:** dec 6 times [6]

Finish stuffing and tie off. Weave in the end.

#### **NOSE** (in dark brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6-9:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 10:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 11-12:** sc in all 24 st [24]

Tie off, stuff and leave a tail for attaching to the head.

Once you have attached the nose to the head, embroider the nostrils on with the black yarn.

#### **MOUTH** (in dark brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4-7:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 8:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Tie off and leave a tail for attachment.

Fold the mouth in half and sew it underneath the nose.

#### **EAR** (make 2 in dark brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** inc 5 times [10]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 5 times [15]

**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 6:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 5 times [10]

**Rnd 7-9:** sc in all 10 st [10]

**Rnd 10:** dec in next 3 st, sc in next 4 st [7]

Tie off. Leave a tail for attaching to the body.

#### **ANTLER BASE:** (make 2 in light brown yarn)

The antlers are made in parts.

**Rnd 1:** start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]

**Rnd 2:** inc 4 times [8]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 2 times [10]

**Rnd 4-17:** sc in all 10 st [10]

**Rnd 18:** (sc in next 3 st, dec in next st) repeat 2 times [8]

**Rnd 19:** sc in all 8 st [8]

Tie off and leave a tail for attaching to the body.

Attach just above the ears.

#### **ANTLER EDGES** (make 8, 4 for each antler base)

**Rnd 1:** start 3 sc in a magic ring [3]

**Rnd 2:** inc 3 times [6]

**Rnd 3:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 2 times [8]

**Rnd 4-6:** sc in all 8 st [8]

Tie off and leave a tail for attaching to the antler base.

When attaching the edges, fold the edge in half and sew them to the base.

**ARMS** (*make 2, start in black yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4-5:** sc in all 18 st [18]

Switch to dark brown yarn.

**Rnd 6-8:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 9:** (sc, dec in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 10-12:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 13:** (sc in next 2 st, dec in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 14-15:** sc in all 9 st [9]

Stuff lightly and tie off. Leave a tail for attachment.

**LEGS** (*make 2, start in black yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** BLO sc in all 36 st [36]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 36 st [36]

Switch to dark brown yarn.

**Rnd 8-12:** sc in all 36 st [36]

Tie off and leave a tail for attachment. Stuff and attach towards the bottom of the body.

**BELLY** (*in light brown yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 8 sc in a magic ring [8]

**Rnd 2:** inc 8 times [16]

**Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [24]

**Rnd 4:** (sc in next 2 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [32]

**Rnd 5:** (sc in next 3 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [40]

**Rnd 6:** (sc in next 4 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [48]

**Rnd 7:** (sc in next 5 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [56]

**Rnd 8:** (sc in next 6 st, inc in next st) repeat 8 times [64]

Tie off and sew to the body in between the legs.



# TARA THE CAT

by Sarsel



**SKILL LEVEL:** \*\*\*

**SIZE:** approximately 8.5 inches (21,5 cm) tall.

**MATERIALS:**

- Worsted weight yarn in dark brown, purple, pink, green and orange. In the example *Vanna's Choice* in taupe, dusty purple, rose, sweet pea and terra cotta was used
- Size F (3.75 mm) and Size H (4.25 mm) crochet hooks
- Embroidery thread
- 15 mm plastic safety eyes
- Buttons and embellishments (optional)
- Polyester stuffing
- Stitch markers
- Straight pins
- Yarn needle
- One long, thin knitting needle (approximately size 5) and one thick knitting needle (approximately size 10), optional but recommended

**NOTE:** The *invisible decrease* method is used in this pattern, abbreviated as *dec*. You can find the tutorial for this stitch in the front of the book.



**HEAD** (in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times. [18]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6:** (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 7:** (inc, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 8-13:** sc in all 42 st [42]

**Rnd 14:** (inc, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [48]

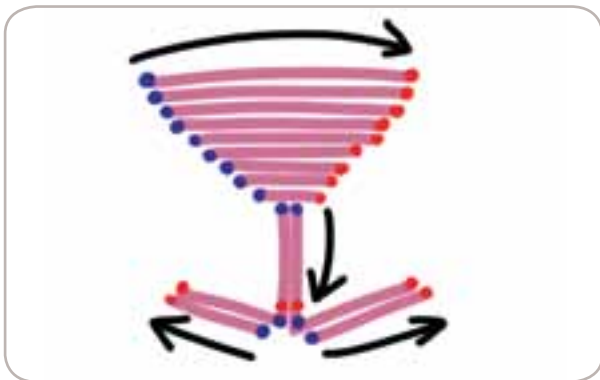
**Rnd 15-16:** sc in all 48 st [48]

**Rnd 17:** (dec, sc in next 6 st) repeat 6 times [42]

**Rnd 18:** (dec, sc in next 5 st) repeat 6 times [36]

**Rnd 19:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 6 times [30]

Add the eyes and embroider the facial features before continuing. In this example the eyes are placed half-way down the head, about 14 rounds from the top, and spaced approximately 12 stitches apart. If the stitches in the head are too small for the posts of the safety eyes to fit through, you can use your thick knitting needle to stretch out the stitches. Embroider the nose and mouth according to the diagram.



**Rnd 20:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 21:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 22:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 23:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Stuff the head generously, putting more stuffing at the bottom of the head to give it its shape. Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

#### **LEGS** (make 2 in brown yarn)

Stuff the legs as you go, putting more stuffing at the bottom to give the foot its shape.

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** BLO sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 5:** sc in next 5 st, dec in next 4 st, sc in next 5 st [14]

**Rnd 6:** sc in next 5 st, dec in next 2 st, sc in next 5 st [12]

**Rnd 7-8:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 9:** sc in next 4 st, dec in next 2 st, sc in next 4 st [10]

**Rnd 10-16:** sc in all 10 st [10]

When you finish the first leg, fasten off. You do not need to leave a long tail for sewing. When you finish the second leg, do not fasten off. Remove your hook from the loop.

#### **Merging the legs:**

Hold the legs upright with the feet facing away from you, the second leg (still attached to the yarn) on the left, and the first leg on the right. You may pin the legs together if it helps them stay in place.

Where the 2 legs touch in the center, re-insert your hook, from right to left, into one stitch in each leg, so your hook is in both legs. Pick up the dropped loop on your hook and pull it back, from left to right, through both legs. Yarn over and pull through once.

Continue to crochet around the outside of the left leg, then proceed to the right, treating both legs like a single piece of crochet. Stop when you've crocheted around both legs once. You should end up with 20 sc. If you have less or more than 20, go back and see if you missed any stitches, or made too many.

You're ready to start the body, but before you continue you need to place your stitch marker where you'll be starting your rounds from now on. Place your marker in the middle back of the body, where you just left off from the previous round. This placement is very important, since the increases and decreases in the later rounds will shape the front of the body. As you work up your rounds, your stitch marker may migrate

a bit off-center. If this happens, just move your stitch marker back to the center.

**BODY** (continued from legs in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** sc in all 20 st [20]

**Rnd 2:** sc in next 8 st, inc in next 4 st, sc in next 8 st [24]

**Rnd 3-5:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 6:** sc in next 5 st, dec, sc, dec in next 4 st, sc, dec, sc in next 5 st [18]

**Rnds 7-8:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 9:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 3 times [15]

**Rnd 10:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 11:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 3 times [12]

**Rnd 12:** sc in all 12 st [12]

Fasten off and stuff the body generously.

**ARMS** (make 2 in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3-4:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 5:** hdc 5 into first stitch. After your 5th hdc, remove your hook from the loop, re-insert it into the first hdc, grab the loop you just dropped and pull it through the first stitch, then yarn over and pull through both. This is the thumb. Sc in each st for the rest of the round.

**Rnd 6:** sc in all 12 st. The thumb has a tendency to hide one of the stitches, so make sure you have 12 st at the end of your round instead of 11. [12]

**Rnd 7:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 4 times. [8]

**Rnds 8-14:** sc in all 8 st [8]

Stuff the arms more at the bottom and put very little (if any) stuffing at the top. Pinch the sides together so the tops of the arms are flat.

**EARS** (make 2 in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 3 times [9]

**Rnd 3:** sc in all 9 st [9]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 3 times [12]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 6:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 3 times [15]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 8:** (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 3 times [18]

**Rnd 9:** Sc in all 18 st [18]

Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing. Your finished ear will look like a cone; pinch the sides together so the ear is flat. The ears are not stuffed.



**TAIL** (in brown yarn)**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

Sc in each st upwards, working until the tail is as long as desired. Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

**ASSEMBLING**

I highly recommend using a long, thin knitting needle to "skewer" the head and the body together, to make



assembling the two pieces easier. It keeps everything in place and prevents things from moving around too much. As you stitch the head to the body, you may want to add a little bit of stuffing to the neck while you work, to keep it from becoming too floppy.

Experiment with the placement of the ears, arms and tail by pinning them on before stitching them on permanently.

**CLOTHING****DRESS** (in purple yarn)

Tara's dress is made of one main piece (which wraps around the body and meets in the back) and two sleeves. Due to variations in yarn weight and tension, the size of your finished amigurumi may vary slightly, which means the main piece of the dress may need to be slightly larger or smaller in order to wrap around your finished doll.

When making the main piece of the dress, you do not have to follow my instructions exactly; it is more important to make sure that the dress fits your doll, which may require you to increase or decrease the number of stitches. Don't worry: it doesn't have to be perfect!

**Main Piece:**

**Row 1:** (ch 3, dc in third ch from hook) repeat until you have created a chain that is long enough to wrap around the widest part of your cat's body. This is the bottom of the dress. I repeat (ch 3, dc in third chain from hook) 7 times; depending on the size of your amigurumi, you may need to repeat it less or more.

**Row 2:** ch 1 and turn; do not work into the dc stitches that you just made. Instead, sc into the original foundation chain. This is a little tricky, since there are no definitive stitches or v's to insert your hook into; just sc across as best you can. I ended up with 21 sc stitches across. Remember, the number of your



stitches will probably vary; don't be alarmed if you end up with less or more.

**Row 3:** ch 1 and turn. sc in each st across.

What you do in the following rows will depend on the size of your doll. Continue to sc across your rows, occasionally checking the fit of the dress by wrapping it around your doll. If the two ends meet in the back, then continue to sc evenly across the row. If the two ends overlap and the dress is too big, space out 2 or 3 decreases evenly across your current row to reduce the number of stitches.

Continue this for about 7 or 8 rows, or until the dress is as long as you'd like it to be. You should end up with a flat piece that wraps comfortably around your doll and meets in the back. Fasten off and leave a long tail, then set aside.

### **Sleeves:** (*make 2*)

When creating your slipknot, leave a long tail.

**Row 1:** Ch 11.

**Row 2:** Turn, sc in all 10 st, starting in the second ch from hook.

**Row 3:** Turn, sc in all 10 st, starting in the second ch from hook.

When you are done making each sleeve, use your yarn needle and pull 1 of the 2 tails through to the

opposite side of the sleeve, so both tails are on the same side of the piece. Attach the sleeves to the top row of the dress. Slip your cat's arms through the sleeves to put on the dress. Using the long tail you left after finishing the main part of the dress, stitch the back of the dress shut.

### **HEADBAND STRAP** (*in green yarn*)

**Row 1:** Make a chain long enough to wrap around your cat's head, usually around 40 stitches. Make a turning chain of 3.

**Row 2:** dc across your foundation chain. Fasten off and sew the ends together to create a circle.

### **HEADBAND FLOWER** (*in orange yarn*)

**Row 1:** Start 10 hdc in a magic ring [10]

**Row 2:** (hdc 5 into next hdc, slst in next hdc) repeat 5 times.

Fasten off and sew to the headband.

### **SHOES** (*in pink yarn*)

Use a Size H (4.25 mm) hook. If you usually crochet with tight tension, loosen your tension while making the shoes.

**Rnd 1:** Start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times. [18]

**Rnd 4:** BLO sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 5:** sc in next 5 st, dec in next 4 st, sc in next 5 st. [14]

**Rnd 6:** sc in next 4 st, ch 6 and skip the next 6 st, re-insert hook and sc in next 4 st.

**Rnd 7:** sc around, working into the chain you made in the previous round.

Fasten off and weave in ends. Because you used a larger hook, the shoes should be slightly bigger than the doll's feet, and will fit snugly.



# SARTÙ THE LEMUR

**SKILL LEVEL:** \*\*

**SIZE:** approximately 6.5 inches (16,5 cm) tall.

**MATERIALS:**

- Sport weight cotton yarn in brown and olive.
- Size B-1 (2,5 mm) crochet hook
- Mustard Yellow and white wool
- safety eyes (9 mm/0.4 inch)
- brown felt
- pipe cleaners
- fiberfill for stuffing



**HEAD** (*in olive yarn*)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc in next 3 st, sc in next 3 st [9]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 3 times, sc in last 3 st [12]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 3 times,  
sc in last 3 st [15]

**Rnd 5:** sc in all 15 st [15]

**Rnd 6:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 3 times,  
sc in last 3 st [18]

**Rnd 7:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 8:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 9:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 10-16:** sc in all 30 st [30]

Place the eyes and felt shapes between round 8 and 9 spaced by 8 stitches.

**Rnd 17:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 18:** (dec, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 19:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

Fill the head.

**Rnd 20:** dec 6 times. Leave a 4 inch (10 cm) tail and finish off.

- Sew the nose with long stitches between the magic ring and round 2 using brown yarn.
- Model the face tightening a thread of yarn between the eyes under the felt shape.
- Sew the mouth with backstitch between round 6 and 7 of the head.

**BODY** (in olive yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4:** (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 6 times [24]

**Rnd 5:** (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 6 times [30]

**Rnd 6-10:** sc in all 30 st [30]

**Rnd 11:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 2 times, sc in next 24 st [28]

**Rnd 12:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 2 times, sc in next 22 st [26]

**Rnd 13:** sc in all 26 st [26]

**Rnd 14:** (dec, sc in next 11 st) repeat 2 times [24]

**Rnd 15-16:** sc in all 24 st [24]

**Rnd 17:** (dec, sc in next 4 st) repeat 4 times [20]



**Rnd 18-19:** sc in all 20 st [20]

**Rnd 20:** (dec, sc in next 3 st) repeat 4 times [16]

**Rnd 21:** sc in all 16 st [16]

**Rnd 22:** (dec, sc in next 6 st) repeat 2 times, finish with a slst [14]

Fill the body. Leave a tail of 6 inch (15 cm) and sew the body between round 12 and 15 of the head.

#### ARMS (make 2 in olive yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2-12:** sc in all 6 st [6]

Insert a pipe cleaner in the arms. Leave a tail of 6 inch (15 cm) and sew the limbs at round 19 of the body.



#### HANDS (make 2 in brown yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 5 sc in a magic ring [5]

**Rnd 2:** (3 ch, slst in second and third ch from the hook, slst in next sc) repeat 5 times

Leave a tail of 4 inch (10 cm) and sew.

#### LEGS (make 2 in olive yarn)

**Rnd 1:** start 6 sc in a magic ring [6]

**Rnd 2:** inc 6 times [12]

**Rnd 3:** (inc, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [18]

**Rnd 4-6:** sc in all 18 st [18]

**Rnd 7:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 6 times [12]

**Rnd 8-9:** sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 10:** (dec, sc in next st) repeat 4 times [8]

**Rnd 11-22:** sc in all 8 st [8]

Insert a pipe cleaner in the legs. Leave a tail of 6 inch (15 cm) and sew the limbs to the body.

#### FEET (make 2 in brown yarn)

Crocheting in rows.

**Row 1:** 3 ch, start in second ch from the hook, sc in next 2 ch, make a turning ch [2]

**Row 2:** sc, inc in next st, ch 1 [3]

**Row 3:** sc in next 2 st, inc in next st, ch 1 [4]

**Row 4:** sc in next 2 st, inc in next st, sc in last st [5]

**Row 5:** (ch 3, slst in second and third ch from the hook, slst in next st) repeat 5 times

Leave a tail of 4 inch (10 cm) and sew.

#### EARS (make 2 in olive yarn)

Crocheting in rows.

**Row 1:** start 3 sc in a magic ring [3]

**Row 2:** inc 3 times [6]

**Row 3:** inc 6 times [12]

Work the inside of the ear with wool thread. Repeat round 1 with mustard yarn and round two with white yarn. Comb with a wire brush to realize a fur effect.

#### TAIL (start in mustard yellow yarn)

The tail's colour will change several times and is indicated for each round.

**Rnd 1:** (mustard yellow) Start 4 sc in a magic ring [4]

**Rnd 2:** (mustard yellow) sc in all 5 st [5].

**Rnd 3:** (mustard yellow) (inc, sc in next st) repeat 2 times [6]

**Rnd 4:** (white) sc in all 6 st [6]

**Rnd 5:** (white) (inc, sc in next 2 st) repeat 2 times [8]

**Rnd 6-7:** (Mustard yellow) sc in all 8 st [8]

**Rnd 8:** (white) sc in all 8 st [8]

**Rnd 9:** (*white*) (inc, sc in next 3 st) repeat 2 times [10]

**Rnd 10-11:** (*mustard yellow*) sc in all 10 st [10]

**Rnd 12-13:** (*white*) sc in all 10 st [10]

**Rnd 14-15:** (*mustard yellow*) sc in all 10 st [10]

**Rnd 16:** (*white*) (inc, sc in next 4 st) repeat 2 times [12]

**Rnd 17:** (*white*) sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 18-19:** (*mustard yellow*) sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 20:** (*white*) sc in all 12 st [12]

**Rnd 21:** (*white*) (inc, sc in next 5 st) repeat 2 times [14]

**Rnd 22-23:** (*mustard yellow*) sc in all 14 st [14]

**Rnd 24-25:** (*white*) sc in all 14 st [14]

**Rnd 26-28:** (*mustard yellow*) sc in next 13 st, slst in next st [14]

Leave a tail of 6 inch (15 cm) and comb with a wire brush to realize a fur effect. Sew the tail between round 5 and 10 of the body.
